





Types of CPD / e-Learning Resources

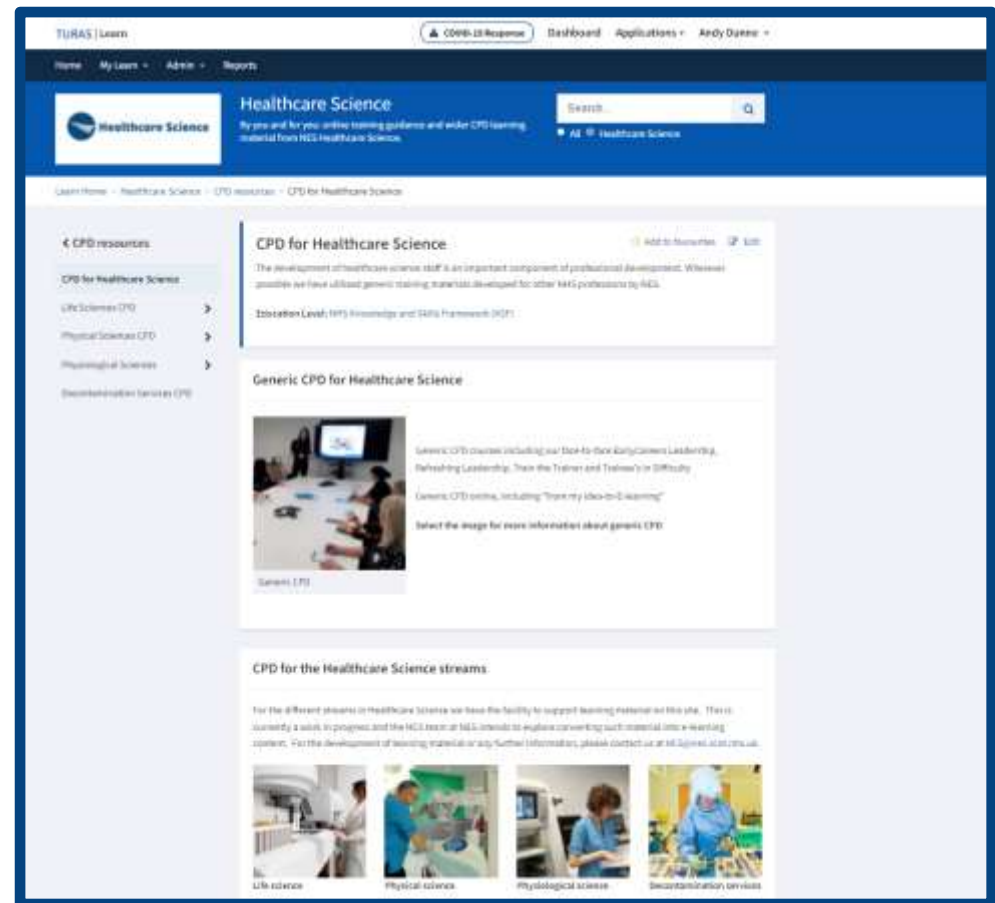
- Fully interactive e-learning modules

 - Presentations with narration

 - Vimeo/YouTube

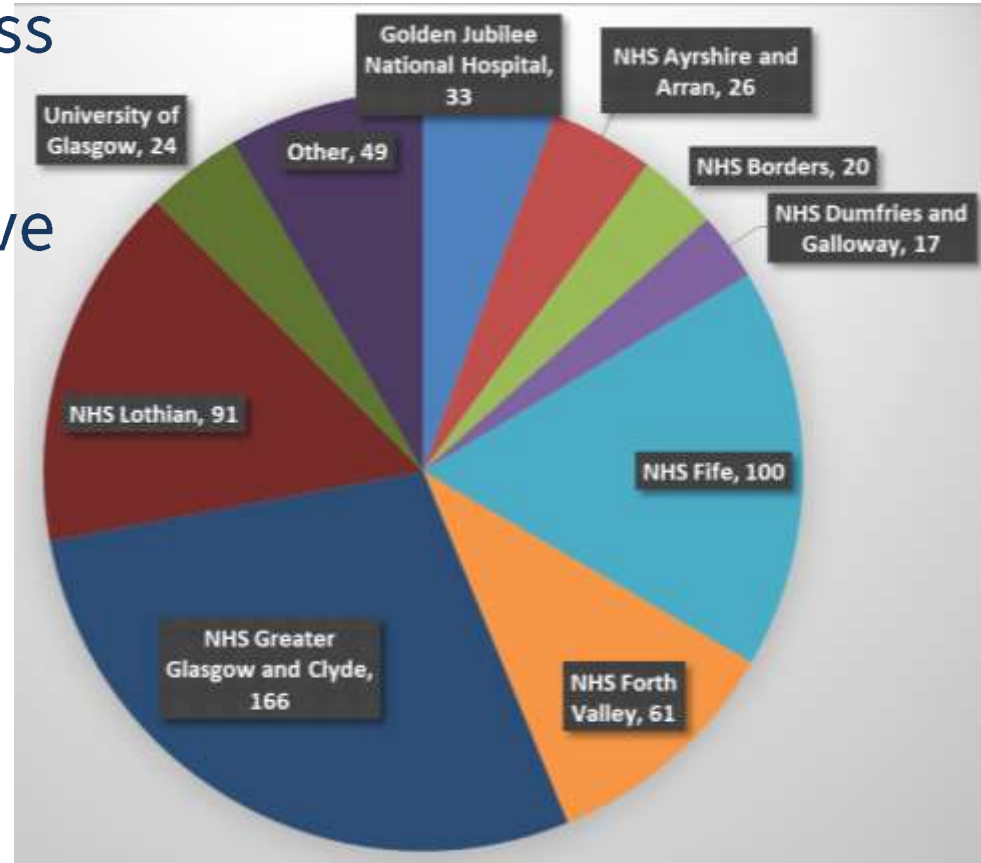

Learning points

- Copyright issues!
- Where applicable, try to develop it to be generic across Scotland
- Various methods of delivering content from videos, slides or a standard e-learning module
- Lots of reviewing – fresh eyes helpful
- Completion reports
- Some initial resistance to moving to Turas but this is improving

Engagement

- Good engagement across our modules
- Some health boards have made modules part of mandatory training
- Most modules were not available elsewhere
- Also adopted by some University colleagues



Take-home messages

- You can develop e-learning modules for your department
- Great experience as a trainee
- Allows you to monitor training or CPD
- Developing modules good for your CPD too
- NES team are fantastic to work with
