

Workshop Descriptors

A1: Environmentally sustainable healthcare in general practice; how we can make a difference

Presenter: Dr Ciara Drummond

The climate emergency is already affecting the health of our patients. To make matters worse, many of the ways that we are currently providing healthcare are contributing to climate change. This workshop will outline the links between climate change, human health and healthcare provision.

We will then share practical suggestions for making the way we practice more sustainable as well as tips for working with colleagues, GP trainees and medical students. Finally, there will be an opportunity for discussion so we can learn from each other and explore how each of us can make a difference in our practice.

A2: Everything you always wanted to know about the ARCP but were afraid to ask

In this workshop you will find out about the ARCP process, what it is and how you can help prepare your trainee for this. We will also cover how information is handled by the ARCP panel and how a trainer can get the most out of the panel.

A3: QI Project Assessment Calibration

A6: Simulation based learning: Tactical Decision Game for GPs

This workshop is part of a research project to explore Tactical Decision Games as a way to use simulation-based learning with trainees. Attendees will complete a Tactical Decision Game that uses scenarios to explore factors that influence prioritisation of on-call tasks.

Participation in this workshop will aid understanding of how experienced GPs prioritise on-call work tasks which will direct the development of a Tactical Decision Game educational resource for GP training.

A7: Reflection in Clinical Case Reviews

How much reflection is enough? How do I assess reflective comments? How do I teach about reflection? This workshop seeks to tackle these issues and help ESs with the assessment of Clinical Case Reviews.

A8: The AKT Exam. How we support trainees to achieve success in the AKT

Scotland has one of the lowest AKT first time sit pass rates in the UK, something I only became aware of recently. In this workshop we will look at common areas of difficulty trainees have in the exam, advising on the best time to sit and how to direct trainees to study for the exam.
