Workshop Descriptors

A1: What's all this stuff about Quality Management of Training?

Presenter: Dr Ken Lee

Ever wondered what Quality Management of Training actually is and how we do this within the Deanery? Why do we bother? This workshop will explain the QM processes we use in GP Training for both Primary and Secondary care posts. There will be discussion on how decisions are made and why. We will look at and discuss the future direction of travel and how QM in GP may evolve.

A2: Active Bystander Training

Presenter: Dr Annabel Shepherd

Active bystander training gives you a framework to identify and tackle undermining or bullying behaviour in the workplace. In this interactive workshop we'll invite you to share your thoughts and experiences, and to develop effective strategies to use when you notice that things aren't right.

A3: QI Project Assessment Calibration

A5: New ES Support and Development

Remember SPESC? This will be an opportunity for ESs in the first few years post SPESC to revisit some of the areas discussed at SPESC with the experience of having done it for real. We will also have opportunity to share the challenges GPSTs have brought and that being an ES brings. We will look at how to deal with them in a positive way and to share learning in the group!

A6: Simulation based learning: Tactical Decision Game for GPs

This workshop is part of a research project to explore Tactical Decision Games as a way to use simulation-based learning with trainees. Attendees will complete a Tactical Decision Game that uses scenarios to explore factors that influence prioritisation of on-call tasks.

Participation in this workshop will aid understanding of how experienced GPs prioritise on-call work tasks which will direct the development of a Tactical Decision Game educational resource for GP training.

A7: Reflection in Clinical Case Reviews

How much reflection is enough? How do I assess reflective comments? How do I teach about reflection? This workshop seeks to tackle these issues and help ESs with the assessment of Clinical Case Reviews.

A8: AKT for Trainers
